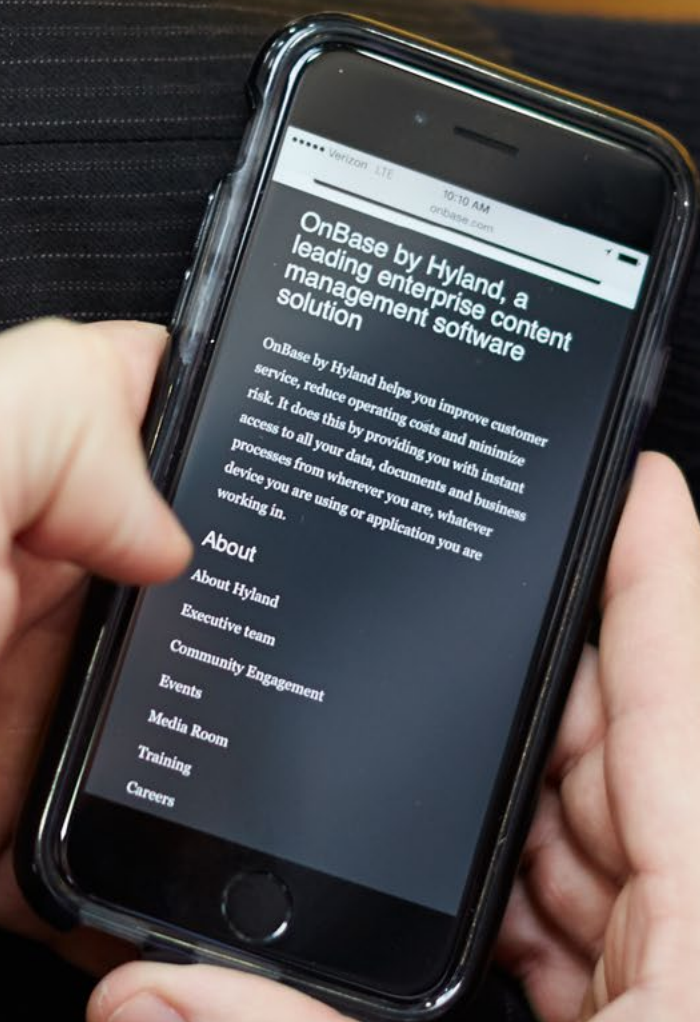




10-ISH THINGS TO ASK WHEN EVALUATING ECM SOLUTIONS
